**Annual Assessment of the Civil and Criminal Dockets
for the United States District Court
Northern District of Ohio
Calendar Year 2011**

The Northern District of Ohio adopted a delay and cost reduction plan in 1992 under the Civil Justice Reform Act (CJRA) of 1990. The CJRA required that each district court annually assess the condition of its civil and criminal dockets in order to take actions that might reduce the cost and delay in civil litigation and improve the litigation management practices of the Court (see 28 U.S.C. §475). Although the CJRA has expired, the Court continues to monitor the status of its civil and criminal dockets through this annual assessment.

Judicial Resources

District Court Judgeships

The Northern District of Ohio is currently authorized 11 district court judgeships. The district had one district judge vacancy in Toledo that extended from June 1, 2010, when Judge James G. Carr entered senior status, until June 18, 2012 when Judge Jeffrey J. Helmick came on board following his appointment by President Barack Obama. In addition to the 11 active judgeships, four senior judges currently assist the Court.

The district's number of authorized judgeships was reduced from 12 to 11 in December 2010 when the Court's temporary judgeship of nearly 20 years expired following the appointment of Judge Kathleen M. O'Malley to the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. Although the Court had been hopeful that Congress would extend the temporary judgeship for an additional five years, it does not appear likely that the Court will regain the judgeship anytime in the foreseeable future.

Magistrate Judges

Northern Ohio is authorized 7 magistrate judgeships. Four magistrate judges are assigned to Cleveland and one each to Akron, Youngstown and Toledo. The district had a magistrate judgeship vacancy in Akron that was created when Judge Pearson was elevated from the magistrate judge position in Akron to the district judgeship in Youngstown in December 2010. The position was filled eight months later in August 2011 when the Court appointed Magistrate Judge Kathleen B. Burke to the bench. In addition to the 7 authorized magistrate judgeships, a retired-recalled magistrate judge also assists the Court in Toledo.

Civil Docket

The success of the Court's case management is demonstrated by the relatively small pending dockets of judicial officers. Because the dockets in the Northern District are managed so well, the Judicial Panel on Multi-District Litigation (MDL) has selected this district to be the transferee court for 12 pending multi-district litigation matters. Significant

civil case statistics include:

- Total civil case filings increased 71.5% from 3,546 in 2010 to 6,080 in 2011 due to a significant increase in MDL filings.
- Traditional civil case filings (which exclude MDL cases) decreased 4.7% from 2,937 in 2010 to 2,800 in 2011.
- Civil case filings per authorized judgeship increased 58.7% from 298 at the close of September 2010 to 473 at the end of September 2011 ranking the court 16th out of 94 in the nation and 2nd out of 9 in the Sixth Circuit. The national average for all district courts increased 2.4% from 417 to 427.
- Case filings in five civil case types increased.

- The number of prisoner petitions decreased 12.0% from 577 in 2010 to 508 in 2011 and has remained relatively stable over the past three years, averaging

about 547 per year.



- Civil case closings, excluding MDL cases, decreased 3.6% from 2,944 in 2010 to 2,837 in 2011.

- The district closed 830 MDL cases in 2011, a 52.5% decrease from 2010.
- The number of cases pending three years or longer decreased 10.3% from 58 at year end 2010 to 52 at the close of 2011.
- The number of pending civil cases increased 56.0% from 4,319 in 2010 to 6,736 in 2011. Excluding MDL cases, the number of pending cases decreased 1.4% from 2,309 to 2,276.
- The number of pro se filings decreased 6.3% from 592 in 2010 to 555 in 2011 due to a 9.5% decrease in Habeas Corpus case filings from 253 in 2010 to 229 in 2011.





Civil Justice Reform Act Efforts

Differentiated Case Management

Pursuant to the Civil Justice Reform Act of 1990, the Northern District of Ohio adopted a Differentiated Case Management (DCM) plan that provides for the assignment of cases to appropriate tracks that operate under distinct and explicit rules, procedures and time frames for the completion of discovery and for trial. The DCM plan provides early involvement of a judicial officer in each case and establishes "event-date certainty" for case management and status conferences, discovery and motion cut-off dates, final pretrial conferences and trials. Under DCM, judicial officers review each case and assign it to one of five processing "tracks": expedited, standard, complex, administrative or mass tort. Each track employs case management guidelines tailored to the general requirements of similarly situated cases, and case management plans are issued to meet the specific needs of individual cases.

Of the 2,277 pending civil cases (excluding MDL) 1,451 were assigned to tracks at year end: 35 (2.4%) were assigned to the expedited track, 647 (44.6 %) were assigned to the standard track, 66 (4.6%) were assigned to the complex track and 703 (48.4%) were assigned to the administrative track. Cases that have not received a track assignment are usually those cases that have been recently filed or those in which an early resolution is anticipated.



Pending Inventory Reduction Plan


At the time the Court adopted its Differentiated Case Management plan, it also adopted a Pending Inventory Reduction Plan (PIRP) to assure the public and the bar that all cases, both new and old, would always receive a fair amount of the Court's attention. The PIRP focuses primarily on the needs of older cases but also addresses the fair and expeditious processing of all cases. The goals of the PIRP are that: 1) no cases pending are over three years old, 2) no motions are pending more than six months, 3) no bench trials are awaiting rulings for more than six months, 4) no case is inactive for more than 90 days, 5) the median time from filing to disposition is reduced from the then 14 months to the national average of 9 months and 6) the "Unassigned" docket is eliminated. Significant PIRP statistics include:

- The number of civil cases three years and older decreased 10.3% from 58 in 2010 to 52 in 2011.
- The number of motions pending six months or longer increased for the first year since 2006, by 154.8%, from 62 in September 2010 to 158 in September 2011.
- The median time from filing to disposition for all civil cases (including MDL), as reported by the Federal Court Management Statistics Judicial Workload Profile, decreased from 13.1 months in 2010 to 10.5 months in 2011. The average for all district courts is 7.3 months.
- There were no bench trials awaiting a ruling for six months or longer at the end of 2011.
- The number of cases inactive for 90 days or more increased 57.3% from 171 in 2010 to 269 at the end of 2011.
- Since the inception of the PIRP, the unassigned docket has been eliminated.

Criminal Docket

While the case management techniques adopted by the Court under the CJRA are being applied to the civil caseload, the effects of the criminal docket on overall case management cannot be overlooked due to the priority criminal cases receive under the Speedy Trial Act of 1974. Significant criminal statistics include:

- Criminal case filings increased 5.6% from 521 in 2010 to 550 in 2011 and the number of criminal defendants increased 23.2% from 781 to 962.

- The number of felony filings per judgeship remains relatively low at 47 compared to the national average of 99. Our ranking is 25 out of 94 nationally and 2nd out of 9 in the Sixth Circuit.
- Criminal case closings decreased 2.8% from 506 in 2010 to 492 in 2011 and defendant closings increased 5.2% from 718 in 2010 to 755 in 2011.
- The number of pending criminal cases increased 12.1% from 421 in 2010 to 472 in 2011 and the number of pending criminal defendants increased 29.6% from 682 to 884.

Civil and Criminal Trials

The Court conducted 36 civil and 37 criminal trials in 2011. According to the 2011 Federal Case Management Statistics Workload Profile, the district ranked 69th out of 94 districts in the nation and 7th out of 9 in the Sixth Circuit in the total number of trials completed per authorized judgeship during the year ending September 30, 2011. Although the number of trials is small, judicial officers spent a considerable amount of time resolving cases through settlement conferences. In 2011, there were 118 referrals from one judicial officer to another to conduct settlement conferences on behalf of their colleagues.

Magistrate Judge Utilization

The magistrate judges continue to play a large role in the management of civil cases. In 2011, there were 322 consents to the jurisdiction of magistrate judges in civil cases, a 19.7% increase from the 269 consents in 2010.


Magistrate judges were the presiding judicial officers for 285 (10.0%) of the 2,837 civil cases that were resolved in 2011 and presided over 210 (9.2%) of the 2,280 civil cases pending at the end of the year. All social security matters and habeas corpus matters are referred to magistrate judges at the time of filing.

Magistrate judges conducted three bench and three jury trials in 2011. Magistrate judges regularly address discovery disputes between parties and conduct preliminary proceedings in criminal cases. In addition, magistrate judges held 267 settlement/mediation conferences in 2011. Magistrate judges also assist the Court by frequently conducting jury voir dire. Magistrate judges have accepted pleas of guilty in criminal cases upon the consent of all counsel and the defendant pursuant to General Order 99-49 since October 1999. In 2011, 198 (21.3%) guilty pleas were accepted by magistrate judges.

Alternative Dispute Resolution

Section 16 of the Local Rules provides a broad menu of non-binding, court-annexed ADR processes designed to provide quicker, less expensive and generally more satisfying alternatives to traditional litigation and the court benefits greatly from the overwhelmingly pro bono services provided by the 241 attorneys who serve on its Federal Court Panel of Neutrals.

Since January 1, 1992, 6,566 cases have been referred to the ADR program and 6,449 cases have been completed. Of the completed cases, 3,474 or 53% were resolved prior to or through an ADR proceeding.



The number of cases referred to ADR increased approximately 4.5% from 335 in 2010 to 350 in 2011. During 2011, 230 cases were referred to Mediation, 2 cases to voluntary arbitration and 118 had settlement conferences conducted by judicial officers other than the one presiding over the case.

Of the 6,449 cases completing ADR since 1991:

- Fifteen percent were resolved after the actions were referred to ADR but before the ADR proceedings took place, e.g. default judgments and dismissed actions.
- Seven percent were withdrawn from the process prior to the ADR proceedings being conducted for various reasons including remands of actions to a state court, automatic bankruptcy stays, parties filing non-consent to voluntary arbitration, the return of actions to chambers for ruling on dispositive motions.
- Forty-six percent were returned to chambers for post-ADR settlement negotiations and further case processing.

The number of cases referred to judicial officers has steadily increased since 1992 when only 2.2% of referrals were made to judicial officers. In 2011, 70.6% of the referrals were made to judicial officers.
































