Annual Assessment of the Civil and Criminal Dockets for the United States District Court Northern District of Ohio Calendar Year 2010

The Northern District of Ohio adopted a delay and cost reduction plan in 1992 under the Civil Justice Reform Act (CJRA) of 1990. The CJRA required that each district court annually assess the condition of its civil and criminal dockets, to take actions that might reduce the cost and delay in civil litigation, and to improve the litigation management practices of the Court (see 28 U.S.C. §475). Although the CJRA has expired, the Court continues to monitor the status of its civil and criminal dockets through this annual assessment.

Judicial Resources

District Court Judgeships

The Northern District of Ohio is authorized 11 district court judgeships. Ten active judges are currently on board with one judgeship in Toledo currently being vacant. In addition to the active judgeships, four senior judges currently assist the Court.

The district's number of authorized judgeships was reduced from 12 to 11 in December 2010 when the Court's temporary judgeship, which had been in place for nearly two decades, expired with the appointment of Judge Kathleen M. O'Malley to the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. The Court had been hopeful that Congress would extend the temporary judgeship for an additional five years, but Judge O'Malley's appointment triggered the expiration of the judgeship, and it does not appear likely that the Court will regain the judgeship anytime in the foreseeable future. Judge O'Malley has received a designation to continue to sit in the Northern District of Ohio through December 31, 2011 and intends to assist the Court by continuing to preside over a small number of cases that are near completion.

Former Chief Judge James G. Carr took senior status effective June 1, 2010, which created the existing vacancy in Toledo. Judge Solomon Oliver, Jr. became Chief Judge at that time. At the end of the summer, Senior Judge Peter C. Economus relocated to Columbus, Ohio, where he will sit by designation assisting the Southern District. President Barack Obama nominated Magistrate Judge Benita Y. Pearson to fill the vacancy in Youngstown that had been created when Judge Economus took senior status in July, 2009. Judge Pearson was confirmed by the Senate and entered duty as a district judge in December.

Magistrate Judges

Northern Ohio is authorized seven magistrate judgeships. Typically, four magistrate judges are assigned to Cleveland and one each to Akron, Youngstown and Toledo. A magistrate judgeship vacancy was created, however, when Judge Pearson was elevated from the magistrate judge position in Akron to the district judgeship in Youngstown. The Court is currently in the process of filling the Akron magistrate judgeship vacancy. In addition, a retired-recalled magistrate judge provides additional assistance in Toledo.

Northern Ohio lost the services of two retired-recalled magistrate judges in Cleveland when Magistrate Judges James S. Gallas and David S. Perelman entered full retirement in late summer and early fall. Toledo Magistrate Judge Vernelis K. Armstrong entered retired-recalled status on February 28, 2010 and continues to assist the Court. The Court appointed James R. Knepp to fill the Toledo magistrate judge position, effective July 30, 2010.

Civil Docket

The success of the Court's case management is demonstrated by the relatively small pending dockets of judicial officers. Because the dockets in the Northern District are managed so well, the Judicial Panel on Multi-District Litigation (MDL) has selected this district to be the transferee court for 12 pending multi-district litigation matters. Significant civil case statistics include:

- Total civil case filings decreased 6.0% from 3,772 in 2009 to 3,546 in 2010.
- Traditional civil case filings (which exclude MDL cases) decreased 1.9% from 2,994 in 2009 to 2,937 in 2010.
- Civil case filings per authorized judgeship decreased 31.8% from 437 at the close of September 2009 to 298 at the end of September 2010 ranking the court 51st out of 94 in the nation and 6th out of nine in the Sixth Circuit. The national average for all district courts increased 2.2% from 408 to 417.

• The number of prisoner petitions increased 3.8% from 556 in 2009 to 577 in 2010. While the number of prisoner petitions has remained relatively stable during the past decade, averaging about 500 per year, the totals for the last three years were unusually high due to large numbers of Habeas Corpus filings.



• Twelve MDL actions are pending comprising 2,136 cases.

- Civil case closings, excluding MDL cases, increased 1.1% from 2,917 in 2009 to 2,944 in 2010.
- The district closed 1,747 MDL cases in 2010. It is anticipated that 1,000 cases could be filed in the DuPuy Orthopaedics litigation by the end of June 2011 and between 10,000 and 20,000 within the next few years.
- The number of cases pending three years or longer decreased 25.6% from 78 at year-end 2009 to 58 at the close of 2010.
- The number of pending civil cases decreased 21.1% from 5,477 in 2009 to 4,319 in 2010. Excluding MDL cases, the number of pending cases decreased 0.3% from 2,317 to 2,309.

• The number of pro se filings increased 10.4% from 536 in 2009 to 592 in 2010 due to a 41% increase in Prisoner Civil Rights case filings from 106 in 2009 to 149 in 2010.





Civil Justice Reform Act Efforts

Differentiated Case Management

Pursuant to the Civil Justice Reform Act of 1990, the Northern District of Ohio adopted a Differentiated Case Management (DCM) plan that provides for the assignment of cases to appropriate tracks that operate under distinct and explicit rules, procedures and time frames for the completion of discovery and for trial. The DCM plan provides early involvement of a judicial officer in each case and establishes "event-date certainty" for case management and status conferences, discovery and motion cut-off dates, final pretrial conferences and trials. Under DCM, judicial officers review each case and assign it to one of five processing "tracks": expedited, standard, complex, administrative or mass tort. Each track employs case management guidelines tailored to the general requirements of similarly situated cases, and case management plans are issued to meet the specific needs of individual cases.

Of the 2,309 pending civil cases (excluding MDL) 1,509 were assigned to tracks at year end: 37 (2.5%) were assigned to the expedited track, 736 (48.8%) were assigned to the standard track, 67 (4.4%) were assigned to the complex track and 669 (44.3%) were assigned to the administrative track. Cases that have not received a track assignment are usually those cases that have been recently filed or those in which an early resolution is anticipated.



Pending Inventory Reduction Plan


At the time the Court adopted its Differentiated Case Management plan, it also adopted a Pending Inventory Reduction Plan (PIRP) to assure the public and the bar that all cases, both new and old, would always receive a fair amount of the Court's attention. The PIRP focuses primarily on the needs of older cases but also addresses the fair and expeditious processing of all cases. The goals of the PIRP are that 1) no cases pending are over three years old, 2) no motions are pending more than six months, 3) no bench trials are awaiting rulings for more than six months, 4) no case is inactive for more than 90 days, 5) the median time from filing to disposition is reduced from the then 14 months to the national average of nine months and 6) the "Unassigned" docket is eliminated. Significant PIRP statistics include:

- The number of civil cases three years and older decreased 25.6% from 78 in 2009 to 58 in 2010.
- Since the district initiated its CJRA efforts, the number of cases that are three years and older has been reduced 85.5% from 399 cases at the close of 1991.
- The number of motions pending six months or longer decreased for the fifth year in a row, by 22.5%, to the lowest figure since 1992, from 80 in September 2009 to 62 in September 2010.
- Since September 1992, the number of motions pending six months or longer decreased 94.7% from 1,169.
- The median time from filing to disposition for all civil cases (including MDL), as reported by the Federal Court Management Statistics Judicial Workload Profile, increased from 10.4 months in 2009 to 13.1 months in 2010. The average for all district courts is 7.6 months.
- There were no bench trials awaiting a ruling for six months or longer at the end of 2010.
- The number of cases inactive for 90 days or more decreased 22.6% from 221 in 2009 to 171 at the end of 2010, the lowest figure since 1992.
- Since the inception of the PIRP, the unassigned docket has been eliminated.

Criminal Docket

While the case management techniques adopted by the Court under the CJRA are being applied to the civil caseload, the effects of the criminal docket on overall case management cannot be overlooked due to the priority criminal cases receive under the Speedy Trial Act of 1974. Significant criminal statistics include:

• Criminal case filings decreased 1.0% from 526 in 2009 to 521 in 2010 while the number of criminal defendants increased 5.7% from 739 to 781.



- The number of felony filings per judgeship remains low at 42 compared to the national average of 98. Our ranking is 78th out of 94 nationally and 8 out of 9 in the Sixth Circuit.
- Criminal case closings decreased 8.0% from 550 in 2009 to 506 in 2010 while defendant closings decreased 4.4% from 751 in 2009 to 718 in 2010.
- The number of pending criminal cases increased 2.7% from 410 in 2009 to 421 in 2010 while the number of pending criminal defendants increased 7.6% from 634 to 682.

Civil and Criminal Trials

The Court conducted 44 civil and 26 criminal trials in 2010. According to the 2010 Federal Case Management Statistics Workload Profile, the district ranked 70th out of 94 districts in the nation and 6th out of 9 in the Sixth Circuit in the total number of trials completed per authorized judgeship during the year ending September 30, 2010. Although the number of trials is small, judicial officers spent a considerable amount of time resolving cases through settlement conferences. In 2010, there were 274 referrals from one judicial officer to another to conduct settlement conferences on behalf of their colleagues.

Magistrate Judge Utilization

The magistrate judges continue to play a large role in the management of civil cases. In 2010, there were 269 consents to the jurisdiction of magistrate judges in civil cases, a 3% decrease from 277 consents in 2009. Since 2000, the number of consents has declined sharply, primarily due to a large decrease in the number of general civil case filings.

Magistrate judges were the presiding judicial officers for 254 (9%) of the 2,944 civil cases that were resolved in 2010 and presided over 195 (8.4%) of the 2,309 civil cases pending at the end of the year. All social security matters and habeas corpus matters are referred to magistrate judges at the time of filing.


Magistrate judges conducted two bench and three jury and trials in 2010. Magistrate judges regularly address discovery disputes between parties and conduct preliminary proceedings in criminal cases. In addition, Magistrate Judges held 169 settlement/mediation conferences in 2010. Magistrate judges also assist the Court by frequently conducting jury voir dire. Magistrate judges have accepted pleas of guilty in criminal cases upon the consent of all counsel and the defendant pursuant to General Order 99-49 since October,1999. In 2010, 156 (23.3%) guilty pleas were accepted by magistrate judges.

Due to the elevation of Judge Pearson from magistrate judge to district judge and the retirement of Magistrate Judges Gallas and Perelman the workload of the remaining five magistrate judges in the Eastern Division has increased. The magistrate judges from Cleveland are rotating between Cleveland and Akron to provide necessary coverage. Additionally, Youngstown Magistrate Judge Limbert is receiving additional work to support the increased workload in the Eastern Division.

Alternative Dispute Resolution

Section 16 of the Local Rules provides a broad menu of non-binding, court-annexed ADR processes designed to provide quicker, less expensive and generally more satisfying alternatives to traditional litigation and the court benefits greatly from the overwhelmingly pro bono services provided by the 244 attorneys who serve on its Federal Court Panel of Neutrals.

Since January 1, 1992, 6,751 cases have been referred to the ADR program and 6,530 cases have been completed. Of the completed cases, 3,503 or 52% were resolved prior to or through an ADR proceeding.



The number of cases referred to ADR increased 24% from 379 in 2009 to 501 in 2010. During 2010, two cases were referred to ENE, 222 cases were referred to Mediation and 274 cases had settlement conferences conducted by judicial officers other than the one presiding over the case.

- Fifteen percent were resolved after the actions were referred to ADR but before the ADR proceedings took place, e.g. default judgments and dismissed actions.
- Seven percent were withdrawn from the process prior to the ADR proceedings being conducted for various reasons including remands of actions to a state court, automatic bankruptcy stays, parties filing non-consent to voluntary arbitration, the return of actions to chambers for ruling on dispositive motions.
- Forty-six percent were returned to chambers for post-ADR settlement negotiations and further case processing.

The number of cases referred to judicial officers has steadily increased since 1992 when only 2.5% of referrals were made to judicial officers. In 2010, 77.4% of the referrals were made to judicial officers.


































