In accordance with Local Civil Rule 3.1(a), Local Criminal Rule 57.9(a)(1), and General Order No. 2009-10, all newly filed civil and criminal proceedings in the Eastern and Western Divisions shall, after being randomly assigned to a District Judge, be immediately randomly assigned to a Magistrate Judge in the following manner:

- 1. For all cases, with the exception of civil social security and habeas corpus cases:
 - a. If the case was assigned to a District Judge sitting in Cleveland, the Clerk shall randomly assign a Magistrate Judge assigned to Cleveland.
 - b. If the case was assigned to a District Judge sitting in either Akron or Youngstown, the Clerk shall randomly assign the Magistrate Judge assigned to Akron or Youngstown.
 - c. If the case was assigned to a District Judge sitting in Toledo, the Clerk shall randomly assign the Magistrate Judge assigned to Toledo.
- 2. Reassignments for all cases, with the exception of civil social security and habeas cases:
 - a. If a case, initially assigned to a District Judge sitting in Akron or Youngstown, is later reassigned to a District Judge sitting in Cleveland, the Clerk shall randomly reassign the case to a Magistrate Judge in Cleveland.

- b. If a case, initially assigned to a District Judge sitting in Cleveland is later reassigned to a District Judge sitting in Akron or Youngstown, the Clerk shall randomly reassign the case to a Magistrate Judge assigned to Akron or Youngstown.
- 3. Magistrate Judge assignments for civil social security and civil habeas corpus cases are governed by General Order No. 2009-10.
