APPOINTING THE OFFICE OF THE FEDERAL PUBLIC DEFENDER FOR THE NORTHERN DISTRICT OF OHIO TO REPRESENT POTENTIALLY ELIGIBLE DEFENDANTS UNDER THE ARMED CAREER CRIMINAL ACT AS A RESULT OF THE ORDER NO. 2015-11 SUPREME COURT'S HOLDING IN JOHNSON V. UNITED STATES WITH THE FUTURE POSSIBILITY OF HAVING PRIVATE OR CJA COUNSEL REPRESENT THESE DEFENDANTS AS THE CLIENT. LAWYER, OR COURT MAY LATER DECIDE

The Court hereby appoints the Office of the Federal Public Defender for the Northern District of Ohio to represent those defendants who have been identified as being potentially eligible for sentencing relief in light of the Supreme Court's interpretation of the Armed Career Criminal Act in *Johnson v. United States*, Case No. 13-7120 (June 26, 2015), covering specifically those defendants whose sentences were calculated in part by the way prior convictions were classified under the ACCA. In the event it is subsequently determined that private counsel or previously appointed CJA counsel should be appointed to represent a defendant, such counsel shall be appointed and the Federal Public Defender shall withdraw.
