The U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio is comprised of eleven authorized District Judgeships, three senior judges, and seven magistrate judges. The Northern District of Ohio is headquartered in Cleveland and has divisional offices in Akron, Toledo and Youngstown. The Pretrial Services & Probation Office has an opening for a Supervisory U.S. Pretrial Services & Probation Officer in Cleveland, Ohio.

POSITION SUMMARY:

A supervising officer is a first line supervisor responsible for the quantity and quality of pretrial and probation services provided by office staff in the full range of operations (pretrial services, presentence investigations and supervision), requirements, and services to the court and public. This position will initially have primary oversight of the presentence unit. The duty station for this position is Cleveland, Ohio, however, incumbent may supervise staff in multiple offices.

QUALIFICATIONS: (Qualifications must be met at the time of application)

EDUCATION

Completion of a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with a major in criminal justice, criminology, psychology, sociology, human relations, business or public administration **is required**. An advanced degree is preferred. Bilingual (i.e. Spanish, Arabic, etc.) is preferred but not required.

REQUIRED EXPERIENCE

To qualify at the CL 29 level, candidate must meet all requirements of a federal law enforcement officer and have at least three years of specialized experience, **including at least one year as a CL 28 pretrial services/probation officer in the U.S. Courts.** To qualify at the CL 30 level, candidate must have at least three years of specialized experience, including at least one year as a CL 29 pretrial/probation services officer in the U.S. Courts.

SPECIALIZED EXPERIENCE

Specialized experience is progressively responsible experience gained after completion of a qualified bachelor's degree in such fields as probation, pretrial services, parole, criminal investigations, or work in substance/addiction treatment. **(Experience as a police, custodial, or security officer does not qualify as specialized experience.)**

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Applicants must be U.S. citizens or eligible to work in the United States. A background investigation with law enforcement agencies, including fingerprint and criminal, financial, and employment record checks will be conducted. Any applicant selected for a position will be hired provisionally pending successful completion of the investigation. This position is subject to mandatory electronic fund transfer (direct deposit) for salary payment. The U.S. Pretrial Services & Probation Office reserves the right to assign/reassign an employee to any location within the Northern District of Ohio based on the needs of the agency. Travel within the state may be required.
